AIS PREP DETAILS

- **Class hours:** 8:50 am – 3:00/4:30 pm, Monday through Friday beginning June 15- July 24 . Field trips are on Fridays.
- **Location:** Idaho State University
- **Cost:** There is no enrollment fee. Students will be provided transportation from designated locations and meals.

REQUIREMENTS

Participant must:

- Fill out the application materials (see “Application Checklist”) by the **March 13th deadline**.
- Incomplete application will be denied.
- Be in good standing in all courses.
- Attend all 6 weeks of AIS PREP. Only **THREE EXCUSED ABSENCES** are allowed before dismissal from the program (see “Frequently Asked Questions” for more detailed information regarding absences).
- Complete **daily** homework assignments. Three missed homework assignments will result in the student missing a Friday field trip and being put on probation until a parent meeting has taken place.

PRIVACY NOTICE:

With a few exceptions, you are entitled to be informed about the data AIS collects about you. “Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974” (FERPA) regulations will be followed to secure all information submitted.

 - Student Personal Information

- WRITE A 50 WORD ESSAY ABOUT YOUR FAVORITE PART OF AIS PREP LAST SUMMER AND WHAT YOU WOULD LIKE TO DO THIS SUMMER!
- Turn in a copy of your most recent report card
 - Must list the school district and school information
 - Contact AIS if you attend a private school or are home schooled
 - Must include a conduct/citizenship grade
 - If you have lost your report card, ask your school counselor for a duplicate on school letterhead
- All paperwork must be postmarked on or before **March 13th, 2020**. ***Don't miss it!***

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. When does AIS PREP begin and end?

June 15, 2020- July 24 2020

2. How many days a week is the program?

AIS PREP runs Monday-Friday for 6 weeks

3. What time does AIS PREP begin and end each day?

8:50 am to 3:00 pm. Tutoring will be from 3:00-5:00. *Subject to slight adjustments.*

4. Where is the program held?

Idaho State University Campus

5. How much does this program cost?

AIS PREP is offered at **no cost** to the participants.

6. What does my child need to bring every day?

Completed homework, a pencil, and backpack to carry materials

7. How will my child get to and from AIS each day?

Pickup and drop off points will be the Blackfoot Plaza and Timbee Hall in Fort Hall.

8. What courses will my student be taking?

Year One students: Logic and its Application to Mathematics, Intro to Engineering, Problem Solving I

Year Two students: Algebra, Introduction to Physics, Problem Solving II

Year Three students: Introduction to Technical Writing, Introduction to Probability and Statistics, Computer science

All students will participate in Career Awareness Seminars, Research/Study.

9. What is the attendance policy?

Each child will be allowed **THREE EXCUSED** absences before dismissal from the program

10. What constitutes an “excused” absence?

Excused absences include illnesses and doctor’s appointments

11. Can my child miss days of AIS PREP to go to other camps (church camps, sports camps, etc.) or family vacations?

AIS PREP’s intensive curriculum moves quickly and students will fall behind if they miss even one day.

Each student will be allowed **three excused absences** before dismissal from the program. No exceptions will be made.

12. What if my child has used the three allowed absences and then gets sick?

Each student is allowed three excused absences and no exceptions will be made. It is best to save the excused absences for family emergencies and illnesses.

13. What is a “Zero Tolerance” policy?

A strict policy on obedience and cooperation is maintained. This means your child will be dismissed from the program for any of the following: cheating, bullying, disrespectful behavior, disregard for written or verbal rules, destruction of property, sneaking out, etc.

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14. Will there be homework and how often?

Expect homework every night in every class. Homework should take 30 minutes to an hour per class.

Students will receive help on their homework during the two hours of tutoring.

15. Will I be able to help my student with their homework?

Because the homework is advanced math and science, AIS will provide tutors to assist students with homework every day during set hours.

16. What happens if my child does not complete a homework assignment?

After the third missed or incomplete homework assignment, the student will miss the upcoming Friday field trip and will stay at ISU campus in a study hall from 8:50 am until 12:00 pm where they can receive the help that they need to catch up. The student will also be put on probation until the parents meet with an AIS PREP leader. The student will be dismissed from the program if a homework assignment is missed after the parent meeting.

17. What is a “teacher nomination”?

Each student is required to submit a teacher nomination. The nomination application is included in this packet, including the instructions for both students and teachers. The teacher will fill out a survey where they will fill out to rate the student regarding academic performance, conduct in class, willingness to participate in class, maturity, punctuality, eagerness to learn new things, etc.

18. Can I apply online?
